On December 6, 2018, WEC Energy Group (WEC) issued this press release: “The board of directors of WEC Energy Group today announced that it is planning to raise the quarterly dividend on the company's common stock to 59 cents per share in the first quarter of 2019. This would represent an increase of 3.75 cents per share or 6.8 percent over the current quarterly rate.

The directors expect to declare the new dividend at their regularly scheduled meeting in January. The dividend – which would be equivalent to an annual rate of \$2.36 per share – would be payable March 1, 2019, to stockholders of record on Feb. 14, 2019.

‘The board's action today is consistent with our objective to target a dividend payout ratio of 65 to 70 percent of earnings,’ said Gale Klappa, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer.

The projected dividend growth for 2019 is in line with the company's longer-term objective to grow earnings per share at a 5 to 7 percent average annual rate.”

This marks the 306th consecutive quarter – dating back to 1942 – that the company will have paid a dividend to its stockholders. WEC Energy Group, formerly called Wisconsin Energy Corporation, with this dividend increase, will have increased its dividend to its shareholders for 16 consecutive years.

WEC Energy Group, based in Milwaukee, is one of the nation's premier energy companies, serving 4.5 million customers in Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan and Minnesota. The company's principal utilities are We Energies, Wisconsin Public Service, Peoples Gas, North Shore Gas, Michigan Gas Utilities, Minnesota Energy Resources and Upper Michigan Energy Resources. The company's other major subsidiary, We Power, designs, builds and owns electric generating plants. WEC Energy Group, a Fortune 500 company and component of the S&P 500, has 8,000 employees and more than \$32 billion of assets.

WEC Energy Group is in the Utilities sector of both our Dearborn Partners Core and our High & Rising Dividend separately managed account (SMA) portfolios. So far this year, 48 of the 49 companies in our Core Rising Dividend portfolio have announced 60 dividend increases averaging about 13.5% more than these particular companies paid a year earlier. Twenty-four of the 25 companies that are currently in our High & Rising Dividend portfolio have announced 32 dividend increases. The average of these dividend increases is about 9.8% more than these companies paid a year earlier.
