Another Dearborn Partners Core Rising Dividend SMA Portfolio Increase: Glacier Bancorp, Inc.

On October 1, 2020, Glacier Bancorp, Inc. (GBCI) announced an increase in the Company's quarterly cash dividend per share to \$0.30 (\$1.20 annualized) from \$0.29 (\$1.16 annualized) up 3.4% from the dividend paid a year earlier. The dividend is payable October 22, 2020 to shareholders of record October 13, 2020.

From the press release: "The Company has declared 142 consecutive quarterly dividends and has increased the dividend 46 times."

From October 2008 through October 2012, Glacier paid a dividend of \$0.13 for 21 consecutive quarters. Therefore, we count this latest increase as Glacier's ninth consecutive annual dividend increase. Glacier is one of the very few banks that neither cut its dividend nor took TARP (Troubled Asset Relief Program) money during the financial crisis and therefore meets our stringent criteria for inclusion in Dearborn Partners Rising Dividend portfolios. So far this year, Glacier has paid a special \$0.30 per share dividend, and a \$0.27 dividend paid in the first quarter as well as declaring this \$0.29 quarterly dividend.

Glacier Bancorp, Inc. is the parent company for Glacier Bank and its bank divisions: Bank of the San Juans (Durango, CO), Citizens Community Bank (Pocatello, ID), Collegiate Peaks Bank (Buena Vista, CO), First Bank of Montana (Lewistown, MT), First Bank of Wyoming (Powell, WY), First Community Bank Utah (Layton, UT), First Security Bank (Bozeman, MT), First Security Bank of Missoula (Missoula, MT), First State Bank (Wheatland, WY), Glacier Bank (Kalispell, MT), Heritage Bank of Nevada (Reno, NV), Mountain West Bank (Coeur d'Alene, ID), North Cascades Bank (Chelan, WA), The Foothills Bank (Yuma, AZ), Valley Bank of Helena (Helena, MT), and Western Security Bank (Billings, MT).

Glacier Bancorp is in the Financials sector of our Dearborn Partners Core Rising separately managed account (SMA) portfolio. So far this year, 31 of 49 companies in our Core Rising Dividend portfolio have announced 36 dividend increases averaging about 7.5% more than these companies paid a year earlier. No companies in this portfolio have reduced or suspended dividends so far this year.
